QUEBEC PROVINCIAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

St. Jean Sur Richelieu, Quebec

The Quebec Provincial Championships have only been held at the Montreal Anglers & Hunters Club (also known as L'Acadie) once before—the 1976 World Olympics. With new management, all new equipment and a host of improvements, L'Acadie was pleased to present these Championships July 31-August 2.

A team of skeet people was assembled to divide up the tasks. To enable a professional shoot, each one of the team members (Bill Golfman, Chris Wong, Jean Robert, Jean Brousseau, Bernard Lagace and Ron Le Couteur) trained and qualified as referees for the year in addition to their organizational duties.

Doubles: Mario Quesnel led the B class with a 91 and was followed by Bill Golfman and Reza Afshar. Wong captured the C1 spot with the rest of the field battling out the D class, led by Simon Richard and Robert.

12 Gauge: Saturday morning brought in a sunny day spotted by white cloud formations. Quesnel led A Class with an 88 and Reza Afshar tied with an 88 in B Class. C Class had a tie at 87 between Wong and Golfman. Richard won D Class and Gary Gosse captured E class.

20 Gauge: L'Acadie is sometimes known for its challenging targets, and the prevailing winds assured that target focus was paramount. Led by Quesnel with a 96 in A class, the B and C classes were led by Afshar and Richard, both of whom managed a 93 under less than ideal conditions. Le Couteur led D class with an 88.

28 gauge: Saturday afternoon 28 gauge was captured with a stellar shoot by Quesnel and a 94 in A class. Afshar and Golfman dominated B class with a 94 and 86, respectively, leaving the balance of the field to fight out D class.

.410 bore: Golfman dominated the field with a 91 in B class, followed by Richard and Wong in C class and Le Couteur in D class, all scoring 80s.

HOA was awarded to Quesnel in A class with a 367, Afshar in B class with

a 353, Golfman with a 355 in C class, Le Couteur with a 315 in D class and Robert winning E with a 303.


Of note, Afshar completed his 25,000-registered target level. Three other members of Club L'Acadie were attempting to achieve the same level in September.
